## About this Action

PCPS<sup>CE</sup> investigates the interactions between the pre-modern media revolution through printing and the emergence of public spheres in Central Europe in early modern history. The Action aims to build a European and global network of stakeholders from education, research and cultural institutions with a special focus on Young Researchers and Innovators. It works towards an integrative methodology that brings together experts from different national and disciplinary backgrounds. The Action includes work on joint publications such as a compendium on the book history of Central Europe and the development of an annotated catalogue of digital data and tools. The initiative aims to promote a new scholarly and public historical awareness of the diverse, non-national pasts of Central Europe. ## Definition of Virtual Mobility Grant:

VM grants are given to a COST Action participant implementing virtual collaborative initiatives. The VM applicant(s) are Action participants with a primary affiliation to an institution located in a COST Full or Cooperating Member country or a COST Near Neighbouring Country participating in the Action. The applicant(s) shall inform the Grant Awarding Coordinator and Core Group about the aim of the VM Grant and how its outcomes will generate benefits to the Action, actively contribute to the overall objectives and relevant deliverables of the Action. The applicant must submit an activity report at the end, to be approved by the Grant Awarding Coordinator and voted by the Core Group.

The maximum amount for a VM grant is 1,500€.

## Main objective of the Virtual Mobility Grant:

The purpose of this VM grant is to reinforce collaboration among Young Researchers and Innovators (YRIs), increase their visibility within the Action, and provide structured opportunities for career development, thereby ensuring the sustainability and long-term impact of the network. A primary deliverable will be the establishment and realisation of a sustainable lecture program for YRIs in Grant Period 2. This will include the full cycle of activities: drafting and publishing the call, managing the submission and selection process, organizing the presentations, securing outcomes through blog publications, and implementing effective outreach and marketing strategies. The role requires organizational and project management skills, experience in academic event coordination, and proficiency in communication and digital dissemination.

## Application process:

The applicant encodes a VM application by logging into e-COST and clicking on the “My Grant Applications”, where a new application can be encoded.

Application on e-COST will be communicated to Joëlle Weis, Grant Awarding Coordinator.
